

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Malaysia is poised to embark on a transformative journey towards **a future of inclusive prosperity**. The Madani Framework, championed by the Malaysian government, seeks to steer Malaysia towards **good governance**, **equity**, **and holistic development**, a trajectory that embodies the aspects of **high-quality development**.

High-quality development, a concept that varies by country, signifies, in the Malaysian context, not only progress that improves the wellbeing of its population but **the potential to do more by capitalising on its cultural and geographical strengths**. High-quality development **transcends conventional economic indicators** such as GDP, labour productivity, and consumer spending. It prioritises the quality of progress, highlighting **environmental protection**, **social fairness**, **access to basic needs**, **and the literacy and educational attainments** of the population, thereby addressing the broader needs of all Malaysians.

The second edition of Malaysia Stay & Build looks at **four high-potential areas** that can spur Malaysia towards high-quality development. Through **cross-sector stakeholder and community engagement** led by the nation's future leaders, the programme will develop a set of policy recommendations in those four high-potential areas in a manner that is both achievable and sustainable. By leveraging our unique strengths and thinking holistically, we can shape a future where progress is synonymous with the well-being and advancement of all Malaysians.





Key Focus Areas for High-Quality Development





Malaysia is facing increasing challenges in flood resilience amid the escalating climate change impacts. Recent events indicate a concerning trend, with Malaysia witnessing a rise in both the frequency and severity of floods, causing widespread disruption to communities, infrastructure, and the economy. The Department of Irrigation and Drainage in Malaysia reports that more than 60,000 individuals were displaced from their houses in 2020 due to flooding. Kelantan, one of the most severely affected states, is still plagued with annual floods after the record-setting flood disaster of 2014, which displaced over 200 thousand individuals. To protect its people and businesses, the nation must fortify its defenses against the increasing threat of extreme weather events. Against this backdrop, participants are tasked with formulating a comprehensive policy framework that addresses the unique challenges posed by Malaysia's geographical and climatic conditions. This framework should encompass holistic strategies for flood mitigation, community preparedness, and sustainable infrastructure development, aiming to bolster Malaysia's resilience in the face of an increasingly unpredictable climate.

Quality Teachers for Digital Literacy



The global landscape is increasingly digital-centric, demanding not only tech-savvy students but also educators adept at imparting these essential skills - this underscores the critical need for comprehensive teacher training in digital literacy. Despite this urgency, a notable gap exists in the digital literacy training provided to teachers in Malaysian primary and secondary schools. As pointed out by the President of the National Union of the Teaching Profession (NUTP), Aminuddin Awang, sporadic online courses given to educators bring limited results. Thus, he highlighted the need for comprehensive teacher training in digital literacy. To adapt to the fast-digitalising landscape, Malaysia must reassess its policy in training the current and older generation of educators. The challenge for participants lies in identifying the systemic challenges outlined in the current state of digital education for teachers in Malaysia and proposing robust policies for teacher training. This policy recommendation aims to empower educators to effectively impart digital literacy to students, preparing them for a digitally driven future.

Positioning Malaysia as a Global Biodiversity Hub



Nestled near the equator, Malaysia stands as a biodiversity hotspot, blessed with rich natural capital that includes some of the oldest rainforests on earth, vibrant coral reefs, and diverse ecosystems. This rich tapestry of biodiversity positions Malaysia uniquely on the global stage, offering an invaluable repository of life that holds the key to scientific discoveries, medical breakthroughs, and sustainable development. As the world grapples with the escalating challenges of climate change and the rapid loss of biodiversity, Malaysia emerges as a potential Global Biodiversity Hub, armed with the ecological wealth needed to spearhead conservation, research, and education initiatives. As a biodiversity hub, Malaysia has the potential to generate high-level jobs, attract investments in research and development, draw renowned scholars from abroad, and position itself as a talent-exporting nation. Participants are challenged to conceptualise and propose an initiative for Malaysia to harness its natural advantage and establish itself as a hub for biodiversity research and conservation to help the nation assume a leadership role in biodiversity preservation.

Combating Child Stunting and Malnutrition



In Malaysia, the prevalence of child stunting for children under the age of five stands at 21.8% in 2019, signifying a substantial increase from 16.6% in 2011. This rate surpasses that of lower-middle-income countries like Ghana (17.5%) and even conflict-affected regions such as Palestine (7.4%) and Iraq (12.6%). Notably, Malaysia's national stunting rate is over three times higher than the overall 6% prevalence in upper-middle-income countries, to which Malaysia belongs. The consequences of stunting extend beyond immediate health concerns, impacting cognitive development, educational performance, and long-term economic productivity. These signal the urgency for focused policies and interventions to safeguard the health and future of Malaysia's children. Participants are challenged to analyse the cause of stunting and malnutrition among Malaysian children and propose innovative policies to curb this alarming trend and ensure the well-being of the nation's future generation.
